NICENE CREED

We have take-out containers and plastic bags available for volunteer use; if you need packaging, please let us know! We take full home-cooked meals as well as sandwiches, sides, baked goods, fruits, etc. We accept individually packaged to-go bags of toiletries, hygiene products, and other essentials so we can hand them out to our guests. We just ask to refrain from donating if you aren't feeling well.
