OUR MISSIONS AND BENEVOLENCE: HousingPlus provides housing and services for women who have been marginalized in New York City—including an apartment to call home. They support women and their children in overcoming poverty, homelessness, addiction, trauma and the impact of incarceration. About 150 women and 94 children now call HousingPlus home. Most of the women are veterans who previously lived in city shelters, Rikers Island or on the street.

CHiPSvstands for for Community Help in Park Slope, a soup kitchen on 4th Avenue. Right now CHiPS cannot serve hot meals, but it's still feeding hungry people by handing out bag lunches every day. Our CHIPS cooking team is providing 45 of those meals (while maintaining safe distancing) every week, so any amount you give would be appreciated.
