While he spent his early years eating fried chicken, mashed potatoes, and macaroni & cheese, he was swooped out of the Deep South further south to Tampa, Florida and eventually to Norfolk, Virginia and then to RAF Lakenheath because his stepfather was in the military. After high school, Lance returned to central Florida, attended a conservative, Christian university where he earned both bachelor and master's degrees and became a Pentecostal minister. After coming out as gay, Lance knew that change was necessary and Princeton Theological Seminary seemed to be his salvation. After earning his Master of Divinity, he moved to Brooklyn, New York where he now happily resides with his partner, Lucas, and their cat, Mollie. He currently serves at a Presbyterian church in Manhattan and as the discipleship pastor at a new church plant, Common Ground Church, while pursuing ordination in the United Church of Christ.
